
A Rocha International (ARI) is one of TRINITY's tier 3 mission partners. A Rocha is a global family of Christian organisations which inspired by God's love, engages in scientific research, environmental education and community-based conservation projects in more than 20 countries (including the UK) across six continents. Coming out of the pandemic has there ever been a more important time for Christians to be mobilised to raise awareness to tackle the twin challenges of biodiversity loss and climate change?

A Rocha have 5 core commitments – Christian, conservation, community, cross-cultural and cooperation. ARI have requested that TRINITY pray and provide practical support for A Rocha India who work to resolve conflicts between humans and elephants in the Bannerghatta National Park. This National Park is adjacent to the urban metropolis of Bangalore and has many other species worth conserving including the threatened tiger.

A Rocha UK aims to equip Christians and churches to protect and restore the environment, through 3 main programmes –

- I. Wild Christian, inspires individuals and families to enjoy and learn about nature together, take practical action at home and in their local areas, and join with other voices for national impact. A Rocha manages two nature reserves: Foxearth Meadows on the Suffolk/ Essex Border, a haven for Dragonflies, which recently appeared on Songs of Praise; and Wolf Fields, an urban nature reserve in West London. - 2. <u>Partners in Action</u>, improves biodiversity, addresses climate change, and makes a real difference to nature restoration in the UK. A growing network of Christian land managers demonstrate active care for the natural world. Locally this includes The Steyning Downland Project and Ashburnham Place, familiar to many at TRINITY.

DONATE THE REBATE

The Financial Times recently published articles encouraging those who can afford it to donate the £400 energy rebate to help fund the frontline work of fuel poverty charities. Here are extracts from an article entitled Donate the Rebate by Claer Barrett:

I have donated my £400 energy rebate to the following three charities working to fight fuel poverty.

Fuel Bank Foundation provides emergency top-up vouchers to people with prepayment meters. We have previously reported in the FT how more and more people are literally in the dark because they cannot afford to buy credit to power or heat their homes. Fuel Bank Foundation has a network of about 400 "fuel banks" around the UK and works with referral partners including food banks. The charity is experiencing record demand right now. It also helps people using its services to access other benefits and forms of help, such as referring them to debt advice. https:// www.fuelbankfoundation.org/

National Energy Action is one of the biggest UK fuel poverty charities. It conducts research, supports those in need and campaigns about the plight of the estimated one in three UK households who will be dragged into fuel poverty by October. https://www.nea.org.uk/

CAPUK (Christians Against Poverty) is one of the UK's biggest providers of free debt advice, and also distributes energy top-up vouchers to people in need and much more. https://capuk.org/

And please don't forget your local food bank. Many are running out of donations as more families feel the pinch, but demand is rising. Check your local bank's website to see what donations of products (including personal care items) they really need. You could also give cash, or volunteer your time.

Many astute FT Money readers pointed out that UK taxpayers could make charitable donations using Gift Aid, thus topping up the donated £400 energy rebate to £500 at a stroke.
