#### TRINITY MISSION PARTNERS SURVEY

In September 2022, we invited the TRINITY church family to participate in a Mission Partners Survey as we seek fresh vision for how, as church, we'd like to support our mission partners both at home and overseas. Thank you to all those who responded and for all the feedback and comments. It has taken a while to process all the responses, and to discuss these with the Mission Committee as well as with Anita and Paul. We are now drafting a document that will enable us to move forward with a fresh vision in 2023 ensuring we reflect the Gospel call for mission. We will share more about this in the coming months.

#### **ROB HOY'S VISIT TO RWANDA AND UGANDA IN FEBRUARY**

After an incredible response to our Harvest Appeal to support a water project run by Rob Hoy, he is going to Rwanda & Uganda with Simon Bacon to start putting the £10,000 (inc. gift aid) to work. Please be praying for this work.

Rob writes..... After a gap of 3 years (triggered by you know what!) I'm returning to Rwanda with Simon Bacon on 15<sup>th</sup> February for a visit in 3 parts.

For the first 2 weeks I will working in Byumba Diocese, as a guest of Bishop Emmanuel Ngendahayo, teaching 20 students how to build 'ferrocement' rainwater storage tanks. These tanks are constructed using sand, cement and thin 'chicken' wire. They are cheaper than plastic tanks and easier to repair if damaged although the skills to build them need to be learned.

We will then be joined by Gill and John Griffith, developer of the Grifaid water filter before travelling down to Cyangugu Diocese on the border with the DRC for a week. There we will visit communities with water filters, widows and friends from the DRC.



Finally we will spend 5 days in Uganda visiting more beneficiaries of Grifaid filters, checking they are using and maintaining the filters correctly, until we return to the UK on  $12^{th}$  March.

### **REVISITING EGYPT - Christine**

It's 5 years since I returned to live in UK after serving in Egypt for 30 years, and because of Covid my 3-week visit in November was only the second time I've visited Egypt since then. It was good to see friends and former colleagues and neighbours and to share something of their joys and sorrows: praying with the pastor's wife suffering from severe cancer, and with a recently bereaved (non-Christian) friend, but also visiting a newly married friend and her husband, and rejoicing in news of births. Egypt was affected by Covid, and is currently suffering from much higher inflation than UK. Egyptian churches and Christian ministries have of course been impacted by both, but I saw and heard very encouraging news of ministry activities, of people coming to Christ and lives being transformed. I was able to join members of my Cairo church for a day of fellowship, teaching and prayer; and it was good to visit Think and Do's community centre in a populous area of Cairo, and to see the developments in agriculture at its "Oasis" centre, and the improved facilities for conferences, large prayer gatherings and vocational training held there. And the way that Egyptian Christians are praying for their nation, and in some cases witnessing to their neighbours at significant personal cost, would put many of us in UK to shame.

#### ISYOUR GARDEN WILDLIFE FRIENDLY?

January is the perfect month to start thinking about making your garden or outside space more friendly for wildlife. You can help animals and birds make it through the winter and plan ahead for the spring and summer.

Here are our Top Ten Tasks for your wildlife garden in January:

- 1. Hang bird feeder and put out food on the ground and bird table https://sussexwildlifetrust.org.uk/discover/inyour-garden/article/25
- 2. Make sure your bird bath is topped up with fresh water and not frozen. Birds need fresh drinking and bathing water even in cold weather, to keep feathers in top condition.
- 3. Regularly clean bird feeders, bird tables & bird bath to prevent build-up of pathogens & mould.
- 4. Dig a pond or create a bog garden https://sussexwildlifetrust.org.uk/discover/in-your-garden/ponds
- 5. Trim back shrubs and trees once all their berries and fruit have been eaten.
- 6. Plant a deciduous tree that produces berries or fruit if you have the space try Rowan (Sorbus aucuparia) blackbirds love it!
- 7. Make a log or rock pile to create areas of shelter for wildlife https://sussexwildlifetrust.org.uk/discover/inyour-garden/article/129
- 8. Build a compost bin https://sussexwildlifetrust.org.uk/discover/in-your-garden/article/19
- 9. Plan a wild flower meadow for spring sowing or planting https://sussexwildlifetrust.org.uk/discover/in-your-garden/article/28
