Open Hands (OH) has been working for more than 13 years helping disadvantaged children and their families in Romania. We aim to break the cycle of poverty which traps so many generations of Romanians, especially those from a Roma background. To achieve this, OH focusses on family support, housing, health and education. It also runs the Rainbow House – a safe haven where children can recover

from experiences of neglect, abuse and trauma, where their many needs are met and they are encouraged to discover their potential. OH's programs benefit over 100 children.

Here we spotlight two areas of OH activity:

Lighthouse CP

In 2021, OH took a step of faith to establish the Lighthouse Program even though there was not full committed funding for it. This is a structured education concept aimed at catching up the lost time from school that so many poor and disadvantaged children suffer. The first project within the program is at Ciprian Porumbescu in north-east Romania, using a building made available by the local authority and employing professional staff. This building is now fitted out with equipment and furnishings appropriate to an educational function, including an inter-active whiteboard.

The teaching is offered in the morning or afternoon depending on the timing of each child's school day. About 40 children can take part. A hot meal is also provided, probably the best meal the children will eat that day.

Ukraine

Following the outbreak of war in Ukraine, OH provided immediate support for refugees – mostly children and parents/grand-parents coming into Romania. That need is no longer there but OH continues to take aid items to Chernivtsi in western Ukraine for people who have fled from other areas.



During the last few months, OH became aware of an orphanage nearby in a place called Magala. This is reminiscent of, and at least as bad, as many of those found in Romania in the 1990s, with children (often with health conditions) virtually abandoned. There is a clear need to for some help to be provided but at present OH is carefully considering what can realistically be done in the present situation.

Please continue to pray for all our programs - that God will bless them and the people running them and that children's lives will be permanently improved.



CREATION CARE - A MARK OF MISSION



In February 2020 General Synod agreed to set out a plan to reach net zero carbon emissions by 2030.

A more recent proposal highlights the increasingly rapid rate of climate change and the need to act accordingly.

The proposal is wide-ranging and asks the whole church to:

- review policies and procedures to prioritise creation care
- invest in renewable energy and divest from fossil fuels
- develop training to deepen understanding of the missionary imperative to care for creation
- commit to pray regularly about the environmental and climate crises
- reduce carbon emissions
- access central support including advice, guidance and central procurement of appropriate products to achieve savings
- lobby HM Government to support the poorest in the world who are suffering the most from the impacts of climate change

ECO TIP FOR JULY



Help hedgehogs in hot weather. Hedgehogs particularly need help in a heatwave, as their usual prey of slugs, snails and worms are often unavailable. Leaving out a juicy snack, such

as mealworms or canned dog food, can help in sustained warm weather. If you have a garden pond, ensure there's always a way for hedgehogs (and other small mammals) to climb out if they fall in.


