Today, half of all plastic is designed to be used just once before being discarded.

And yet some 2 billion people in lowand middle-income countries don't have access to solid-waste collection.

They have little option but to burn or dump it.



It's people in poverty who are suffering the worst impacts of this rubbish problem. They are forced to live and work among piles of waste, which is making them sick, releasing toxic fumes, flooding communities and causing up to a million deaths each year. But Jesus told his followers that even the smallest amount of faith can move mountains.

So we can put our faith into action and join TEARFUND in demanding an end to plastic pollution and make some choices and changes to our behaviour in purchasing and waste.

During 2023/24, nearly 150 governments are meeting to develop the first ever global **treaty** on plastic pollution. But it's not a done deal.

PRAYER REQUESTS FOR MISSION PARTNERS

LOCAL WILDLIFE RESCUE SERVICE

If you spot an injured, trapped or vulnerable wild animal or bird, please call the Wildlife rescue team on 0300-10-26-999.

They are volunteers who come out to assist, rehabilitate and return these creatures to their natural habitats. They do a wonderful job and have skill and experience.

East Sussex WRAS was established as a voluntary group in 1996, but some of its rescuers have been rescuing since 1985. The organisation was set up in order to provide a front-line rescue service for wildlife casualties. See https:// wildlifeambulance.org/ for more information.

PRISON FELLOWSHIP: ANGEL TREE

Each year, Prison Fellowship organises the delivery of small Christmas presents from parents in jail to their children. This involves lots of joyful activity - collecting prisoners' requests and personal notes to their children, fundraising, buying the presents, wrapping and posting or handdelivering to the families.

ECO TIP FOR OCTOBER

Provide food and shelter for wildlife, now and in preparation for next year.

Clean all your bird feeders to avoid the spread of disease to winter migrants and put up a nest box well in advance of breeding season.



A nest box could also prove a cosy spot for small birds to spend the night on particularly cold winter evenings ahead.

RECYCLING OF PLASTIC TOYS

Tesco now have a container in store for recycling of broken hard plastic Toys (not with soft materials).

This is in addition to Tesco's containers for recycling of used Make-up & Toiletries, for used Batteries, and for all types of Soft Plastic Bags, Film & Crisp Packets.

Please use these facilities to help reduce waste of materials, and environmental pollution. Thank you!

DON'T BANK ON PLASTIC

99% of plastic comes from fossil fuels and plastic production is increasing. This is fuelling climate change and causing pollution which harms the health of people and planet.

Some major banks are making profits by financing the plastics industry. Think about whether you could join the call for large banks in the UK to lead by example and invest in a fairer, greener future.
